

FRONT COVER NEWS

Mildred Riley, Branch Leader of St Peter's Darwen, throws more light on the 'Front Page' item of the Summer edition of MU News.

I have my mother's Enrolment Card for 1945 and it is exactly the same as the one you published. Slightly more interesting was the name of the Church on the card – St John the Evangelist – which was in Darwen. It was pulled down in the 1970's owing to dry rot and Darwen also lost St George's Church around the same time. The church in the town centre was Holy Trinity but when all three churches merged it was decided to call it St Peter's – also it was joined at that time to St Paul's in Hoddlesden, which is a village outside Darwen.

When we celebrated 100 years of the Mothers' Union in the Parish we paraded all the old banners into church and they are now on permanent display in the Chapel in St Peter's, together with a window dedicated to the Mothers' Union. The aumbry in the Chapel was also purchased to celebrate 100 years of the Mothers' Union in the Parish.

18 months ago, the First World War Memorial from St John the Evangelist was re-dedicated into St Peter's Church. It had spent some time living in St Peter's School (which was originally St John's) but it was felt it was more suitable to be in a Church. One lady who was a relative of three of those named on the Memorial came to the town's Remembrance Day Service and spoke about the history of her family mentioned on the Memorial.

The Prayer/Spirituality Units are concerned with the spiritual development of the membership so that the organisation as a whole has a distinctive spirituality. The Action & Outreach Units provide resources and information to members. Let us pray that the Units work closely together and coordinate across the dioceses to the encouragement and support of Highveld MU and the others in their Cluster.



A current project of Highveld MU is supporting child-headed families. Children are taught the skill of planting their own vegetable patches. This assists the children to be able to grow their own crops and provide themselves with a daily meal. This has been done to curb child prostitution.

Also in attendance were the Mayor of Accrington, Councillor Tim O'Kane, and the Mayoress, Melanie Storey, Enid Nutland, Marjorie Holt, Rev Dr Stephen Adesanya, the Area Dean, Rev Ian Enticott, and representatives from the neighbouring Deaneries of Whalley, Burnley and Blackburn. Enid presented members with their Long Service Certificates, one of which was to Mrs Mary Duxbury for 65 years, and the Service was followed by refreshments.

St Cuthbert Darwen Branch have held two events for the 90th birthday challenge




Member Lynn Ripley ran in the Darwen Half-Marathon in April and collected sponsorship amounting to £525. With Gift Aid, the final total should be over £600.

By the time the Ukulele Band gave their performance, followed by other musical items and a 'Last Night of the Proms' Finale by Pilling Jubilee Silver Band, most of us had wrapped ourselves in blankets to protect ourselves from the chill night air. all! An Ecumenical Rogation Service, held in one of the marquees on the Sunday morning, was well attended. We look forward to perhaps another similar event next year. She told those present how her interest in music started when she was just three years old. She managed to persuade her parents to buy her a piano – once they knew she was genuinely interested in music and was prepared to put in the practice. >

She worked hard and attained her BA (Hons) Degree in Music and Performing Arts at Lancaster University and then a Post Graduate Certificate in Education, specialising in Music, at Liverpool Hope University. She does a lot of work with choirs in the locality.



After her talk, Katherine had all standing to 'sing for their supper' - singing in rounds to familiar tunes, after which all were thirsty and hungry and enjoyed a splendid buffet supper. There was also an opportunity for a little retail therapy - thanks to the MU stall brought by Christine Hodgkinson - and the raffle was drawn.



Kathryn rounded off the evening with getting all to practise some deep breathing exercises before singing in rounds again.

It was a really enjoyable evening and thanks are due to Marian Hartley, who invited Kathryn to be guest speaker, and to all the ladies who helped to make it such a successful and enjoyable evening.

Christ Church Wesham and Christ Church Treales Branch members were delighted to welcome Nicky Ward from North West Blood Bikes to their May meeting. Her determination to raise awareness of the charity was clearly evident. Despite only working for the Blood Bikes for two months she volunteered to speak at the meeting when the original speaker fell ill. All the riders are volunteers with 90% of them using their own bikes and paying for their own boots, waterproofs, gloves and helmets. However, only a handful of women are in the group. She feels great pride in being one of them.



Northwest Blood Bikes formed in 2015 with four riders taking 10 months to complete 500 runs. There are now 300 riders with a total of 34,000 runs completed. They work 365 days a year, covering shifts from 7pm – 2am. >

They deliver blood, instruments, patients' records, breast milk and medications to hospitals here in Lancashire and the Lakes. A very dedicated group of controllers form the backbone of the organisation and help it run smoothly and safely – checking weather reports, riders, rotas, confirming pick-ups and drop-offs, etc. Nicky held the attention of all members, especially when they went outside to see the bike. It had been donated to Blood Bikes and cost £17,000. It was a very interesting and informative evening.

On 13 June, members had the pleasure of welcoming Mark Curtis from the charity Donna's Dream House in Blackpool. Mark, Donna's brother, told us all about his sister and her illness and the three wishes she had before she died. Firstly, she wanted to raise money for Trinity Hospice - to repay their kindness to her and her family. Secondly, she wanted to send children to America to enjoy the same dream holiday she had had and finally, she wanted to provide accommodation in Blackpool for children with life-threatening illnesses and their families. Her wishes are now a reality.



Mark explained that, whilst the voluntary team of Donna's Dream House provides the expertise, enthusiasm and administration, it is the generosity of many companies, organisations and individuals in raising and donating money that makes it possible to bring not only sunshine and fun into children's lives but a sense of wonder, adventure, laughter and a much needed holiday in Blackpool for the whole family. Recently the charity has expanded its facilities – through many generous donations – providing a pleasure cruiser, Donna Marie II, based in Garstang, to take families on short outings along the Lancaster Canal.

Mark believes passionately in Donna's Dream House and is keen to help create treasured smiles and precious memories, fulfilling Donna's dream in making a difference to the lives of children affected by serious illness or bereavement.
