WHY GIVE GENEROUSLY?

When you are making your regular offering to your church you are making it possible for the Church to have a ministry across Lancashire.

The largest Diocesan expenditure by far is the funding of parish clergy.

Recently some national research was commissioned that came up with a breakdown of a typical clergy week. Each clergy person will be different of course, but in general their week can consist of the following...

30%

Worship and the preparation of worship

25%

Pastoral care of congregation members

15%

School and other children/youth activities

10%

Preparation for baptisms, weddings and funerals

10%

Community outreach and missional work

10%

Preparation of activities and events; administration; governance and communication

SHARE RELIEF FUND

Families help each other out in difficult times and support is available to parishes in relation to payment of Parish Share.

WORKING TOGETHER VISION 2026

Brief guide to 2018 Diocesan Budget and Parish Share







Welcome to our Parish Share leaflet for 2018, summarising the Parish Share budget presented to Diocesan Synod in October 2017.



The receipt of Parish Share is vital to our work as a Diocese and in achieving the aims of Vision 2026.

Parish Share doesn't pay for things like the running of the Cathedral or the

administration of Bishops' offices, but it does pay for parish clergy. Indeed, the budgeted income from Parish Share in 2018 is £7,714,456 whilst expenditure on parochial staffing and related costs will be £8,262,548.

Put simply, Parish Share is a mutual pooling of financial resources to make possible Anglican ministry and mission to the 1.3m people of Lancashire.

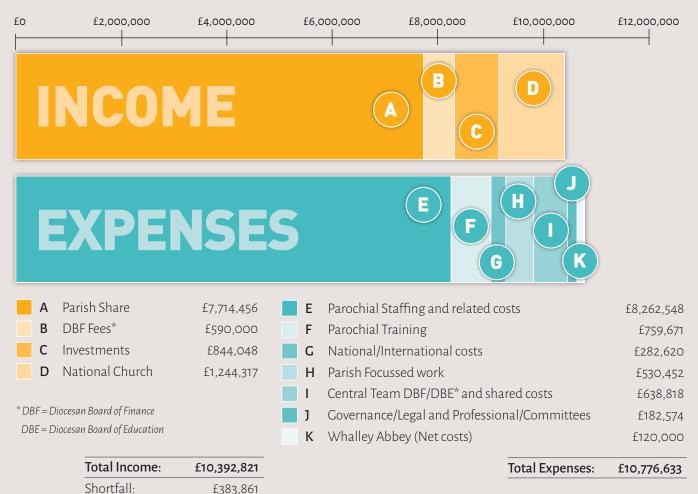

BUDGET BREAKDOWN



The 2018 Parish Share budget presented to Diocesan Synod represents a 2% increase in the amount requested from parish assessments. Whilst the budget shows Parish Share and DBF fees separately, parishes can continue to make one payment each month to the finance team and simply send in the information on their fees each quarter.

The budget is set and reviewed by various committees of the Blackburn Diocesan Board of Finance before it is presented to the Diocesan Synod. The assessment sent to each parish, using the formula agreed by Diocesan Synod, is made up initially of a fixed amount per incumbent or self-supporting minister plus a fixed amount per regular weekly attender (RWA). Several adjustments for inter-parish support are then applied.

The fixed amount per incumbent is rising by approximately 2%, as are the costs allocated by RWA. Unfortunately, the total RWA across the diocese used in the 2018 parish assessments is down by 3.6% on the figure used in the 2017 parish assessments, so the amount requested per RWA is having to rise by 5.6%. This year £384,000 of reserves are being used to support the budget.
