resource for	reflection on preaching from the lectionary. We take a look at the way we read and
self-guided	interpret scripture as preachers, considering the different "worlds" of the text and
learning)	discovering the importance of finding "trouble".
	By the end of this session, students will be more confident in exegeting the Bible and
	recognise the questions they bring to the text.
02/03/21	Session 2b – The Content of Preaching Part Two (Living in the Story of Scripture)
7.15pm –	This is a practical session (solely for those training as ALMs) where we journey deeper into

	God speaks through the scriptures to different people. They will be able to compare
	different readings of the text.

7.15pm –	We look at what is sometimes called "congregational exegesis" and consider the task of

Zoom	begin to look at the choices that preachers make to determine a focus and function for
	their sermons.
	By the end of this session, students will be able to make better informed choices about
	sermon structure and content based on their "reading" of the congregation.
16/03/21	Session 4 – The Call to Preach
7.15pm –	We consider the skills, habits and spiritual disciplines required to be an effective preacher.
9.00pm	This session includes hearing a "live" sermon and interviewing a guest preacher.

	By the end of this session, students will be able to identify the responsibilities of a preacher
	and reflect critically on the importance and impact of their own prayer and devotional life
	on preaching.
23/03/21	Session 5 – The Craft of Preaching
7.15pm –	We look at different ways that sermons are crafted, considering introductions, signposts,
9.00pm	transitions, and endings. We also discuss practical things such as voice control, notes and
Zoom	scripts.
	By the end of this session, using an example, students will be able to describe and discuss
	the way they have structured a short talk.
