If applicable, what was your former job before entering ministry?	I currently work for BAE Systems in an administrative capacity and will continue to do so after ordination.

Tell us something about your journey towards ordination?

I grew up in a Welsh Presbyterian Church but drifted away in my teens. In my mid 40s I became aware of a call from God, a constant niggle that just wouldn't go away, and I started attending my local Parish Church in Hoylake. Training as a Reader (LLM) was interrupted by my move to Lancashire and then by COVID lockdowns. This gave me time to reflect on what type of ministry God was calling me to and, over time, I came to realise it was ordained ministry in an assistant (SSM) capacity.

What has been a) the most important thing you have learned and b) the most inspiring thing you have experienced during your training? (They can be different!)

Answer for A:

Patience. God will make things clear but in His time, not mine.

What are some of the personal challenges and opportunities you face in your ministry in the coming year?

Time is my biggest challenge. A full-time job coupled with helping my wife look after my elderly mother and trying to 'hold the fort' in two churches during an interregnum has been pressured. However, it has been a great opportunity to fulfil the ministry to which I have been called.

Many more parishes have embraced online opportunities to engage with their local communities alongside their existing services; especially since the pandemic. Please indicate ways in which you may have done this already or what plans you may have to explore ways to reach people in the 'digital space' in the future:

I continue to work on improving and expanding the online presence of the churches where I serve as curate as part of my principal aim to ensure those churches are focussed on mission and church growth
