before entering ministry?

Tell us something about your journey towards ordination?

Sense of call to youth ministry aged 13 after becoming a Christian the same year. Trained at Ridley Hall in Cambridge as a Youth Worker. Spent 6 years at St. John's Blackheath in South East London. Loved it there but felt a comfort setting in in life and faith; the stories I was telling of God at work in my life were months old. I knew there was something more and God was calling us on but didn't know where or what. Maybe overseas. Prayed 'Lord, we will go anywhere in the world you want us to go ... except the North of England because it's cold'. A week later we received a message from the then Vicar of Beacon Church, Rev. Adrian Wolton, who asked if we'd be up for a chat about the ministry here in Blackpool! After that conversation we came up to Blackpool and walked the streets of Revoe and Foxhall (two of our neighbours in the Parish). It was hear that God broke our hearts and Hannah and I left our roles in London to move into the neighbourhood and share the role of Eden Team Leader. Over the following year we saw God at work and his faithfulness, in our lives, the church and our wider community. Many families coming to faith from little to no church background. Over that time, I felt an increase call to lead sacramental ministry missionally in our community. Fast forward 3 years, Hannah and I are leading Beacon together and will be here until God calls us on.

What has been a) the most important thing you have learned and b) the most inspiring thing you have experienced during your training? (They can be different!)

Answer for A:

A further appreciation for the missional aspect of the sacraments, especially the Eucharist and the invitation Christ extends to all around His table.

Answer for B:

In a church often marked by polarisation and conflict, Emmanuel under Rev Dr Michael Leyden, creates space where everyone can come, share, learn and worship together, genuinely believing that each other are Christians and trying, like ourselves, to work out what it means to follow Him faithfully.

What are some of the personal challenges and opportunities you face in your ministry in the coming year?

Hannah and I are expecting our second child in August 2025, which is a wonderful blessing but obviously adding a new born into the mix with a toddler, continuing study, ministry in our context and simply being a
