(Candlemas)



Preparation

Today gives us the chance to focus upon the joy of Christmas one last time before looking to the season of Lent which is not far away.

Before you begin you may wish to place a favourite Christmas decoration (or nativity set) on a table and light a candle.

There might be a really special gift you received at Christmas – you could perhaps place that on the table too.

You may wish to find a song to play at the start of your prayer time (something like Away in a manger or another Christmas carol).

Gathering

We meet together in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen

Today the Lord is presented in the Temple. Alleluia!

Today Simeon proclaims Jesus as the Light of the nations and the glory of Israel.

Alleluia!

Praise to Jesus, the Light of the World!

Saying sorry

As we worship Jesus, let's remember the things we need to say sorry for. We might say these out loud to each other.

For not following Jesus: Lord, have mercy. Lord, have mercy.

For not being kind to each other: Christ, have mercy. Christ, have mercy.

Words of Forgiveness

May the God of love and forgive us and free us from our sins, heal and strengthen us by his Spirit, and raise us to new life in Christ our

Lord. Amen

The special prayer for today

Lord Jesus Christ, light of the nations and glory of Israel: make your home among us, and present us pure and holy to your heavenly Father, your God, and our God. Amen

The Word of the Lord

Luke 2.

Then when the days stipulated by Moses for purification were complete, they took him up to Jerusalem to offer him to God as commanded in God's Law: "Every male who opens the womb shall be a holy offering to God," and also to sacrifice the "pair of doves or two young pigeons" prescribed in God's Law.

In Jerusalem at the time, there was a man, Simeon by name, a good man, a man who lived in the prayerful expectancy of help for Israel. And the Holy Spirit was on him. The Holy Spirit had shown him that he would see the Messiah of God before he died. Led by the Spirit, he entered the Temple. As the parents of the child Jesus brought him in to carry out the rituals of the Law, Simeon took him into his arms and blessed God:

God, you can now release your servant; release me in peace as you promised. With my own eyes I've seen your salvation; it's now out in the open for everyone to see:

A God-revealing light to the non-Jewish nations,

and of glory for your people Israel.

- How good are we at waiting for things?
- What can we learn from the experiences of older people?
- How might we present Jesus to the world?

Moving from the Crib to the Cross
