Dear Friends,

These are extremely difficult times for church leaders and we are acutely aware of the intense pressures on you all as we come to the weekend. Many people are expressing strong opinions and doing so very forcibly, but the highly complex and emotive decisions that we need to make pertain to the worship of God and so must be made calmly and peacefully. Please try to give yourself space and time to rest in Christ.

We need to bring to your attention an <u>open letter</u> from the Directors of Public Health for Lancashire which was made available via various social media channels and strongly advises places of worship to close during the period of the lockdown. Whilst our advice remains unchanged until next week when the Bishops nationally will be consulting with government for clarity and Bishop Julian will be in dialogue with civic and ecumenical leaders, we accept that many of you may now choose to close your churches for public worship after this coming Sunday whilst remaining open for private prayer.

Others of you will choose to continue to offer worship in churches. There are widely varying rates across the Diocese so please allow your decision to be informed by local factors such as these. You can find up to date rates in your area by inputting your post code here or check county wide figures for comparison each day here.

The particular concern that lies behind this advice from Directors of Public Health is people gathering before and after worship. Churches that are offering worship on Sunday should take every possible step to ensure that people arrive and disperse safely and promptly.

We will return to this difficult area next week once national conversations have taken place. Meanwhile we will continue to support and advise all churches that make informed decisions based on risk assessments, whether that be to offer public worship or not.

We are profoundly concerned about the horrible dilemma in which clergy and lay leaders have been placed, faced with contradictory advice nationally and regionally. These are really tough times, especially for those of you new to incumbency. Please use every support network you have. Don't think twice about picking up the phone to a Bishop, an Archdeacon or an Area Dean or sending an email to coronavirus@blackburn.anglican.org to set up a conversation.

This is, and remains, very strongly the view of the Task Group and no national church guidance has yet been issued. The best source of advice for guidance on this issue is the RSCM, so if you decide that singing is critical to your worship please follow closely their advice which is here.

Whilst this area of ministry has once again had to be suspended, don't forget that there are excellent resources available via the Diocesan Board of Educations which offer Christian content to families and churches.

These podcasts have accumulated over 27,500 listens but many of these are outside our Diocese, so it is a great resource to share with people.
