- "Follow me."

Why metaphor?¹

- They attract attention
- They add colour or vividness
- They make abstract concepts more concrete
- They help retention
- They abbreviate an idea
- They encourage reflection
- They are emotive as well as intellectual

Unpacking the Metaphor

Sheep

- Sheep are not stupid
 - They can recognise faces and voices and make decisions based on this recognition
- Sheep are defenceless
- Sheep are prone to wander
- Sheep live best in community
- Different sheep have different needs

Food

- Location
- Quality
- Availability
- Dependence or independence



Dangers

- Thieves
- Wolves
- Other threats:
 - Weather
 - Not enough food & water
 - Neglect
 - o Being driven too hard
 - o Disease
 - o Terrain
