Welcome to this year's Visitation service

Thank you for being here this evening and for your commitment to taking on the role of churchwarden in your local church for the year ahead. It is humbling to know how you all in your various ways have served the communities of our diocese through the last year, which has been the most remarkable year most of us will ever live through.

I would like to thank those of you who have served as a warden for the past year, and welcome those of you who are new to the role.

We are now in a time of unlocking our society after an experience which will live for us with us for the rest of our lives. The church has continued to serve local communities, even though at points in the past two years we have been forced to close our doors because of COVID-19. We have demonstrated a remarkable commitment to being the parishes of England in that time and that has been most marked in this Diocese of Blackburn.

At time of preparing this order of service, we are also facing a crisis in Europe, following the invasion of a sovereign nation by an aggressive neighbour and this is no doubt going to colour and influence our mood and view of the world for years to come.

We are at the moment not just unlocking a local church but unlocking and refreshing our diocesan vision 2026 with all that means. So, we seek to be healthy churches, transforming communities.

The New Life in Christ

I appeal to you therefore, brothers and sisters, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. Churchwardens to be admitted stand

Bishop Julian:

Churchwardens are called to represent the people of God; to work with the leadership of the parish, ordained and lay; to be an example and encouragement to their fellow Christians; and to promote unity and peace.

As you come to be admitted, I ask you to affirm your commitment to this calling, and to seek God's grace and the power of his Holy Spirit to fulfil it.

Will you, as Churchwarden, seek to work with the Bishop, the Parish Priest, the Parochial Church Council, and all those who exercise leadership in your parish, to further the mission of God and his purposes in the world?

I will, the Lord being my helper.

Will you undertake your task as a spiritual calling, and seek, through the power of the Holy Spirit to promote true religion, unity and peace? I will, the Lord being my helper.

Will you care for the fabric and property of the church, as stewards under God, and make it your responsibility to ensure its proper upkeep and repair? I will, the Lord being my helper.

God give you grace to serve him with dedication, cheerfulness and humility, and may his all-powerful Spirit direct your paths throughout the coming year, through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**
