70 years for Adoption Matters is celebrated

Leading adoption agency, Adoption Matters, held a celebratory afternoon tea event at Whalley Abbey recently in the beautiful Ribble Valley recently to celebrate its 70th Anniversary. More than 70 people from across Lancashire attended the 40s-themed event including adopters, donors, local authority partners and representatives from the Diocese of Blackburn, including the Bishop of Blackburn, Rt Rev Julian Henderson and the Archdeacon of Lancaster, The Venerable Michael Everitt. The agency has its roots going back to 1947 with the Blackburn Diocese Adoption Agency and also Chester Diocesan Adoption Services. Those two agencies merged in 2007 forming Adoption Matters.
