Diocesan Synod, including Presidential Address

Diocesan Synod this month heard Bishop Julian give his Presidential Address on the theme of 'God's favour', looking at the achievements of the last year; giving an overview of the work for Vision 2026 and looking ahead to future plans – including the next Diocesan Conference, now booked for 2021. Other business included reports on the financial accounts for the Diocesan Board of Finance and the Diocesan Board of Education; a motion to ratify Lower Income Communities Funding (LICF) from the national church should be targeted directly at parishes in most need and a further motion for sending to General Synod calling for weddings fees to be set at nil or a minimal amount. The summary report on the Diocesan website includes links to the full text of the Presidential address in written and audio format alongside links to other relevant files.

Bishop Julian says: "We are looking forward to all these speaking engagements and we ask for people's prayers for safe travel, good health and blessing on our times of ministry."

South Asian Christian Convention

People from across the County and beyond attended the third South Asian Christian Convention for The Church of England in Lancashire, which was held on Sunday at St John's Church, Nelson. The theme of the Convention was 'Come, follow me...' based on one of the key aspects of the Diocesan Vision 2026: Specifically, 'making disciples' for Jesus Christ.
