## FROM THE WARDEN OF PASTORAL ASSISTANTS, MRS MANDY STANTON

Dear Colleagues,

I have been thinking recently about the Epiphany, and the subject of gifts. An offertory prayer sometimes used in churches includes the words 'All things come from you, and of your own do we give you'. Everything we offer to be used in the service of the kingdom comes from God originally.

The gifts offered by the Magi were gold, frankincense and myrrh: a valued possession, something used in worship and prayer, and a symbol of mourning. When we think about offerings to God we often think first about our possessions and our skills and talents. I'm very grateful for the skills and the time which all of you offer to help others in your ministry as PAs. We may also talk about offering our worship and our prayers to God – and I believe firmly that the things we do, and the conversations we have, happen differently if we offer them to God in prayer before we start. And what about our griefs and sorrows? We need to offer the whole of our lives to God – our strengths and weaknesses, our love and anger, our joys and our sorrows. That can sound like an easy answer – but often if we trust God with our pain and unhappiness, we receive comfort and strength to deal with things, and God may help us to offer our experiences in love to bring help and comfort to others.

The Quiet Day held on Saturday 28th October at Quernmore, led by Jonathan Carmyllie, provided some of us with 'Holy Ground' to find time and space to be quiet and to listen to God. There were some practical issues, which we will try to resolve for future Quiet Days.

The next Training Day will again be run twice (with the same content both times) in different locations, once on a Saturday and once during the week, for the morning only. This pattern seems to allow more people to attend. The subject of the morning, in response to requests, is marriage and relationships. Details elsewhere in this newsletter.
