# FROM THE WARDEN OF PASTORAL ASSISTANTS, MRS MANDY STANTON

Dear Colleagues,

I wonder how many of you watched the wedding of the Duke and Duchess of Sussex – Harry and Meghan – in May? Of course, there was a lot of comment on the dress, the music and the family dynamics, but I was struck as well by the level of interest on social media and by the newspapers and television commentators in Bishop Michael Curry's talk. Although some religious professionals were critical of the Bishop's theology (and others complained about the length of his talk), many people were bowled over by his passion, his enthusiasm, and his positive message. Ed Miliband, for example, commented that Michael Curry 'could almost make me a believer' (@Ed\_Miliband on Twitter, 19th May).

The key message of the speech (not, technically a sermon) was, of course, what MP David Lammy referred to as 'the redemptive power of love' (@DavidLammy on Twitter, 19th May). The Bishop invited his listeners to imagine a world 'where love is the way'; the difference this would make to our homes and families, our communities, governments, business and commerce.

I believe that what motivates many Pastoral Assistants and Pastoral Visitors is the desire to share God's love and Christ's compassion with others in ways that make a difference in our churches and in our communities. But to do that, we need to be in tune with what God wants for us and for other people, and part of that is being connected to God through prayer.

We are offering two dates for our next Quiet Day, as we know that not everyone is available on Saturdays. The Quiet Days will be held on Friday 19<sup>th</sup> October at St Wilfrid's Church, Ribchester and Saturday 20<sup>th</sup> October at Tabor Centre, Fulwood (we will make sure we send directions to people who book, after some people had problems finding our last venue!) The Quiet Days will be led by the Revd Canon Patricia Impey, and will explore ways of prayer using all our senses. I look forward to seeing many of you there.
