Eternal God, in the cross of lesus we see the cost of sin and the depth of your love: in humble hope and fear may we place at his feet all that we have and all that we are, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

The Word of the Lord

FIRST READING: Lamentations 5.15-end

- ¹⁵ The joy of our hearts has ceased; our dancing has been turned to mourning.
- ¹⁶ The crown has fallen from our head; woe to us, for we have sinned!
- ¹⁷ Because of this our hearts are sick, because of these things our eyes have grown
- ¹⁸ because of Mount Zion, which lies desolate;

jackals prowl over it.

- But you, O LORD, reign for ever; your throne endures to all generations.
- ²⁰ Why have you forgotten us completely? Why have you forsaken us these many days?
- ²¹ Restore us to yourself, O LORD, that we may be restored:

renew our days as of old-

²² unless you have utterly rejected us, and are angry with us beyond measure.

Come, let us worship.

O Saviour of the world, who by your cross and precious blood have redeemed us,

save us and help us, we humbly pray.

Prayers of intercession

We pray for all who suffer in body, mind or spirit... we pray for all prisoners, captives and refugees... we pray for all at the point of death and those who watch beside them...

We remember those who have died in recent days, and all whom we love but see no longer...

After a period of silent prayer:

Holy God, holy and strong, holy and immortal, have mercy upon us.

Standing at the foot of the cross, as our Saviour taught us so we pray:

Our Father in heaven...

Concluding Prayers

Almighty Father, look with mercy on this your family for which our Lord Jesus Christ was content to be betrayed and given up into the hands of sinners and to suffer death upon the cross; who is alive and glorified with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**
