St John's church is a living church, where our members have a real and living faith in Jesus Christ. We seek to be active in sharing the wonderful Good News that Jesus is God's son who died to set us free from sin and gives us the opportunity to experience 'life in fullness'.

Our relationship with St John's school is important to us as church. We pray regularly for the staff and children, in our worship and in our other meetings. We lead collective worship most Thursdays, and welcome the children, staff and parents into school for Harvest, Christmas, Easter and Year 6 Leaver's celebrations. Children visit school at other times during the year too.

Our weekly 'Chill Zone' ministry to young families meets in school each week and has become a place where those who are open to learning more about the Christian faith in an informal, caring setting can come and share time together.
