

## Benefice of the Redeemer Blackburn



## Background

The Benefice of the Redeemer is an evangelical benefice made up of two churches, St Bartholomew's Church and Church of the Saviour, in South Blackburn, Lancashire. The churches have separate PCCs but share a vicar. St. Bartholomew's will be the lead parish on the project.

**St Bartholomew's Church** is situated in the large, newly built 'Fernhurst' housing estate of owner occupied, 3/4 bed detached homes occupied by families. Persimmon are currently building hundreds more family homes in the parish. St. Bartholomew's has a usual Sunday attendance of 50-60 adults and 20-30 Ul6s. There is a Children and Youth Team made up of around 15 volunteers over a creche, younger Sunday School, older Sunday School and a Sunday afternoon youth group. This team has a clear 'Vision for Children and Young People', meets termly, and is currently led by the Benefice vicar. The church meets in, and benefits from, a church primary school, 'The Redeemer Primary'. There is a close working relationship between the Benefice vicar and the headteacher of the school with school year groups being invited to contribute to Sunday services each year. One of our volunteers currently runs a lunch time Bible club for years 5&6 called 'Superstars'.

The Church of the Saviour has two congregations: an informal family 'messy church' style service on a Friday afternoon/early evening with usual attendance of about 20 (roughly 50/50 split between adults and children), and a more traditional Sunday service of 30-40 adults and 5-8 children. A couple of years ago we appointed an Assistant Minister to oversee our outreach in Saviour parish. As a result, the Sunday congregation has seen significant growth, especially in terms of families and young people. Due to this growth there is now a small group of 'Kids Gang' leaders who supervise a creche and teach a separate kids group most Sundays. The church benefits from good and growing relationships with the 'Longshaw Community Infants School' and the 'Longshaw Community Junior School' where the minister runs after-school clubs. The church also benefits from good buildings and facilities and is situated in a large social housing council estate in an economically deprived area.

The two churches work closely as a Benefice. They share resources, have a joint vision for children and young people, run joint house groups and explorer courses and run a joint youth Bible study group.



# **Job Description**

Job Title: Ignite – Youth and Children's Leader

**Salary:** 26K – 30K per annum (depending on experience)

Hours: 35hrs per week

Location: Benefice Office St Bartholomew's Church, Jack Walker Way, Blackburn. BB2 4JJ.

Responsible to: Rev. Chris Anderton

**Responsible for:** Overseeing the development of the youth and children's ministry in the Benefice of the Redeemer with a particular focus on discipling youth (Key Stage 2 and upwards).

#### Purpose of the role

To oversee the youth and children's ministry in the Benefice of the Redeemer with a particular focus on discipling youth.

#### Overview of the main aims

- · Seek to effectively oversee and streamline the existing C&Y work.
- · Support, train, equip and grow our children and youth leaders so they can confidently and faithfully teach young people.
- · Communicate effectively with and involve parents.
- · Develop our Benefice youth work so that our youth group grows in number and our youth work reaches more young people.
- · Be involved in the discipleship of young people at our Friday and Sunday morning services.
- · Continue to build a church culture where young people are valued and encouraged.
- · Make the most of opportunities with our local schools.
- · Ensure children and young people are safeguarded effectively.

Given the nature and context of the work, it is an occupational requirement that the post holder should be a communicant member of the Church of England or a full member of a church within Churches Together in Britain and Ireland, in order to fulfil the main purpose of the post. This post is therefore exempt under Schedule 9 of the Equality Act

#### Main responsibilities

- · Oversee our youth and children's ministry across the Benefice.
- · Disciple and nurture the Christian faith of children as they transition in the secondary school age group.
- · Build relationships between the church and families in the community.
- · Teach the Bible to children and young people in groups and in an all-age setting.
- · Establish greater links with local schools (junior and secondary).
- · Provide training and nurture / identify possible C&Y leaders and develop and assist with providing quality teaching resources.
- · Develop the benefice youth provision increase the amount of youth events and the amount of young people attending church.
- · Attend and contribute to weekly staff-meetings, supervision meetings and PCC meetings as required.
- · Bring young people along to Youth Camps and get involved where appropriate.
- · Use social media to promote engagement with children and young people.
