Being Witnesses: Notes for Course Leaders

As you work through the course material you will find that each session follows a similar format:



Equipment: A list of what you will need to run the session.



Timings: The overall session length. In each session you will find suggested timings for each activity.



Session Aims: An overview of the main themes for the session.



Opening Prayer: Beginning the session in prayer and by using either the Blackburn Diocesan Vision Prayer or some other suitable prayer.



Getting Started: Introducing the theme for the session and beginning to explore ideas within the group.



Bible Passage: Exploring Scripture together and discovering Biblical teaching related to Vision 2026



DVD Teaching input: A short DVD programme which provides introductory teaching input.



Exercises and discussion: An opportunity to explore ideas together with other group members.



Prayer Reflection: A closing prayer activity.



Take it Away Materials: Thoughts or activities to help group members continue to reflect on the session.

Within each session you will find suggested timings for the material:

- The material has been organised to allow 1 hour 15 minutes for each session.
- If you are able to meet for 1 hour 30 minutes then you will have more space for discussion and reflection.
- Please be flexible about the timings. If a particular discussion is proving very fruitful then feel free to allow extra space for this.
- It is also worth trying to work with these timings so you leave enough space for the materials later in the session
