- 'Knowing the Scriptures Better': A focussed six-week study booklet which Ruth has developed, enabling you to consider the Bible more deeply, with memory verses to learn and space for your notes as you pray and talk to God. - 'Pathways to Prayer': This is a wonderful opportunity for all people of every tradition to explore fresh perspectives and styles of prayer, contemplation and meditation through a diverse range of workshops. - 'Bishop's Bible Challenge': This initiative encourages us to learn key verses of Scripture, to create a kind of 'internal treasure store' of the promises and commands of God. It works like this: 12 verses (one a month for a year) have been chosen for each of three Vision 2026 themes of making disciples, being witnesses and growing leaders; hence 36 verses in all.
